# Campaign Oversight

## **Office of Personnel Management**

OPM maintains eligibility and public accountability criteria that all participating CFC charities must meet, makes admission decisions for all national and international charity applicants and resolves local charity admission appeals. OPM also sets strict requirements and provides on-going guidance for the conduct and activities of the LFCC. Additionally, the fiscal integrity of the campaign is verified by OPM compliance audits.

## **Local federal Coordinating Committee (LFCC)**

Each Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) must have an oversight body, Local Federal Coordinating Committee (LFCC). The LFCC is comprised of Federal employees and, whenever possible, members of local Federal inter-agency organizations, such as Federal Executive Boards, Federal Executive Associations, Federal Business Associations or, in the absence of such organizations, self-organized associations of local Federal officials. LFCCs act as the campaign's "Board of Directors" and, as such, have direct oversight of the finances and conduct of the CFC in their community.

For the CFC Hawaii-Pacific, the LFCC is the Executive Committee of the Honolulu-Pacific Federal Executive Board (HPFEB), which has an assigned Chair and Vice Chair, rotated annually on an elected basis.

# Overview

## The Campaign Zone

The Combined Federal Campaign Hawaii-Pacific (CFCHIP) (zone 02) is a unique campaign zone that encompasses the state of Hawaii, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, and American Samoa. The zone is comprised of approximately 94,000 personnel (federal civilians, DoD civilians, and uniformed service members on permanent, deployed, and temporary duty) from 141 agencies: the largest of which is DoD (representing 89 percent of the potential donor base) including multiple military installations supporting every branch of service.

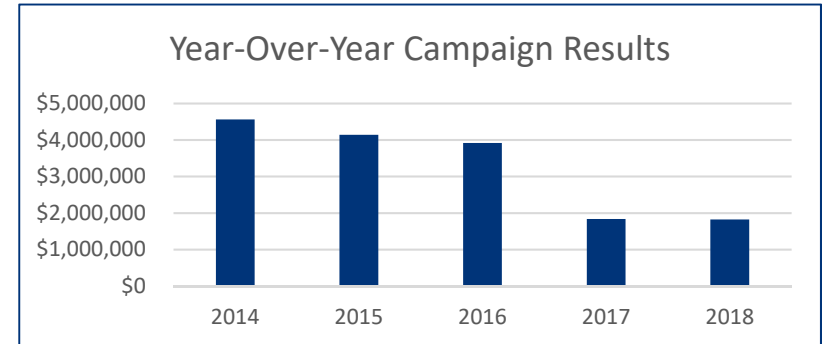
## 2018 Results

The generous men and women contributing their money and time via the 2018 CFC HIP pledged more than \$1.8 million. This made the CFCHIP one of the top 10 zones in the country in achieving the highest percentage of results in comparison to the previous year. The overall average gift increased 21 percent, volunteer hours pledged increased by 13 percent, and giving by retirees more than tripled from 2017 to 2018.
