The CFC Heroes Awards are given to the campaign's "unsung heroes" who made significant differences and demonstrated leadership qualities in their campaign.

Congratulations to the following CFCHIP Hero Awards winners:

Ms. Mackenzie Walsh, Tripler Army Medical Center

Through her dedication and innovation throughout the campaign, Ms. Walsh was instrumental in helping Tripler Army Medical Center (TAMC) surpass their 2020 goal of \$30,000, reaching a over \$34,000. She increased campaign visibility by assisting with social media promotions, publishing monthly CFC articles, developing content for the kickoff video, coordinating challenges and events, such as a parking spot incentive, and built CFC Thermometers to help increase daily reminders and promotion. Through these efforts Ms. Walsh increased participation by new donors and helped TAMC increase their total dollars raised by 30% over 2019 and 206% over 2018.

Ms. Kiana Crown, US Postal Service Processing and Distribution Center

Ms. Kiana Crown implemented a successful CFC Campaign and went above and beyond the call of duty in service of the campaign. In addition, to her position as the APO with the USUS Processing and Distribution Center, Ms. Crown received active-duty order for six months during the campaign season. Each day after completing her Army duties, she would go back to the USPS Distribution Center to make contact, distribute materials, and create spreadsheets to motivate and education keyworkers and donors, many of whom did not have access to a computer. Ms. Crown's efforts helped lead to a 1,594% increase in total dollars raised over 2019 and the highest total raised for the Agency for the past four years.
